Call to Order, Introductions

Approval of Meeting Summary

Guest Speaker

Sarah Ruether, Long Range Planning Manager, Skagit County Planning & Development Services
Sarah Ruether gave a brief update on Agritourism

- Agritourism Survey
 - We have Redone the survey; it is now much shorter and better to understand by everyone
 - We are hoping to get public input and more involvement
 - PDS and Berk Consulting have broadened the outreach and involvement-sent out cards to over 16,000 Unincorporated Skagit Residents.
 - Will add more knowledge and history to webpage:
 - We will add a two page document on the current zoning and history
 - Postcard will have a QR code to do the survey online
 - We will be having outreach events and have paper copies available for anyone who wants to take the survey in person

- We expect a 4-5% return rate of people who take the survey
- Old survey was found to be bias- hope the new shortened version that has been addressed,
 Terry Sapp
 - Tried to make it unbiased, asked what we should be allowing
- Kept the zip code question
- WSU could possibly be a location for dropping off paper surveys
- o Can't stop Agritourism, we just need to try and limit it, and enforce the rules
- There is now a box to explain your answer on the survey
- Peter Browning stated we need to hear from more people, what would dismantle Ag in Skagit,
 what will make it better
- o We need to protect the farmland, it is in State Law to do that-GMA
 - Support and preserve Ag Land, need to balance and make it fair
 - Maximum of 24 events in a year helps keep it to where you can't make a living

New Business

2022 Docket Update

Michael Hughes gave an update on the Docket Process:

- Ag Worker Housing has been rescinded
- Moving forward include:
 - LR22-01 Small Scale Recreation and Tourism Rezone: rezone four parcels form Rural Reserve to Small Scale Recreation and Tourism zone.
 - C22-1 Wind Turbine Use Amendment: add wind turbines as an allowed use accessory to residential structures.
 - o C22-2 Critical Areas Ordinance Correction: Code correction in SCC 14.24.080(4)(c)(vi). Reference to subsection (6) should be a reference to (5)(b).
 - C22-3 Guemes Island Overlay Side Setback Amendment: remove preferential side setback requirements for the Guemes Island Overlay to be consistent with other areas of the County.
 - C22-4 Economic Development Plan Amendment: add a new goal to the Economic Development Chapter (Chapter 11) of the Skagit County Comprehensive Plan to ensure public facilities are eligible for state economic development grants.
 - C22-5 Seawater Intrusion Areas Amendment: change the requirement for a County
 Hydrogeologist to review proposed new wells in a seawater intrusion area to instead allow for a licensed hydrogeologist employed or engaged with the County to perform the review.
- Presenting to the Planning Commission at their October
- Steve Omdal- Ag Luncheon
 - O David Molina put together a letter with good points for Ag. Should we look, read, or amend the letter and pass along? Don read the letter to the Board.
 - Michael Hughes suggested we wait and see how it progresses. The AAB doesn't need to be involved now.
 - Steve Omdal thinks if a letter wants to move forward should we be a part of it? Kraig Knutzen thinks we need more information, this should be more for Legislative and the AAB is more County Driven, not really our position. More likely would be Western Washington Ag's place.
 - Individual farmers can sign on, just not the AAB
