#### Call to Order, Introductions

#### Approval of Meetings Summary

#### Guest Speaker

Jack Moore, Director Skagit County Planning & Development

Jack gave an overview of the Solar and Battery systems project that is proposed to be placed on property that is in Skagit County within the Agricultural Natural Resource land. He explained that the proposed Battery Systems are a part of the Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council (EFSEC), also referred to as the Goldeneye project and has the full supported of State legislatures. Jack also discussed the potential of a balanced technical advisory group to review this project.

# Michael Hughes, Chair of the Agricultural Advisory Board

Michael spoke shortly about the EFSEC project and how this project will affect the tax rates for the community. Michael mentioned that there is a possibility of the state legislator implementing a fixed tax rate.

- Michael informed the group that the tax rates would go up, but the cost would be spread out over the years to follow
- Although the tax rates would raise, there is a possibility that the state could execute a fixed tax rate, in the next 3-5 years

# Jack Moore, Director Skagit County Planning & Development

Jack gave an update on Agitourism and the 2025 proposed comprehensive plan. Regarding rural and natural resource sections, the revisions are mostly clarifying the verbiage of the text. He also elaborated on the fact that the comprehensive plan will be consistent with codes/laws.

- Gave an overview of the 2025 comprehensive plan for rural and natural resource lands
- Re-assured board that the 2025 plan is set to be consistent with the current codes and laws in place
