Proposal Description

Describe your proposed amendment.

Skagit County needs an accurate database of buildable lands in rural zones. To our knowledge this as never been completed.

Skagit County is making policy decisions regarding development without information to assess cumulative development scale, costs, location or impacts to available parcels in rural zones as well as resource zones. Economic impacts for long term effects of development cannot be created without accurate data as a baseline.

A buildable rural lands inventory and assessment should address the entire County and give the County a better baseline and data for planning, permitting and code enforcement.

Adopted functional plans and the CFP must be based on accurate projections of available lands for current and future uses. Currently this information is not included in these plans.

13. Describe any public review of the request that has already occurred.

None directly, although many citizens have commented to the Planning Commission, departments and the BOCC during public hearings.

Notices

Fees. No fees are required for a policy or code change suggestion, per SCC 14.08.020(6).

Docketing. SCC Chapter 14.08 governs the process for docketing of Comprehensive Plan amendments; suggestions for changes to the development regulations are docketed following the same process. Docketing of a suggestion is procedural only and does not constitute a decision by the Board of County Commissioners as to whether the amendment will ultimately be approved. Amendments are usually concluded by the end of the year following the request. State law generally prohibits the County from amending its Comprehensive Plan more than once per year.

Submission deadline. Suggestions must be received by the last business day of July for docketing. Suggestions received after that date will not be considered until the following year's docket.
