Describe your proposed amendment.

Amendments to the section on Conservation and Reserve Developments (CaRD) to require the following:

- 1. CaRDs be allowed only in UGAs.
- 2. CaRDs have a cap that limits the scale of the development in relationship to the reserve land size.
- 3. CaRDs that exist currently in Skagit County have permanent easements on the reserved portion of the parcels which are NOT reserved for future development but provide permanent protection on that portion of the land.
- 2. Describe the reasons your proposed amendment is needed or important.

Skagit County has permitted a number of CaRD developments outside the UGAs and are inappropriate for rural scales of development and density. Protecting rural character is a goal of the policies, CP and codes. Design standards are needed to prevent suburban "subdivisions" from using up Skagit County's rural lands.

Language would be written to achieve the goal of putting future CaRDs in UGAs and changing the easement level of protection on the reserved lands.

Policies on CaRD should be changed to reflect the new level of protection on reserve portions of existing CaRDs. New policies should be added to reflect any changes that strengthen the urban/rural development percentages. CaRD policies that increased development outside of UGAs should be revised.

Approximately 82,000 acres are designated rural lands and

11. Describe the anticipated impacts to be caused by the change, including geographic area affected and issues presented.

The geographic area affected is all lands in rural zonings across Skagit County. A change in the CaRD regulations should give additional protection to rural lands, encourage creation of design standards for CaRDs and encourage additional density in UGAs.

12. Describe how adopted functional plans and Capital Facilities Plans support the change.

These plans support additional density in UGAs and conservation of rural lands with appropriate development.

Docketing. SCC Chapter 14.08 governs the process for docketing of Comprehensive Plan amendments; suggestions for changes to the development regulations are docketed following the same process. Docketing of a suggestion is procedural only and does not constitute a decision by the Board of County Commissioners as to whether the amendment will ultimately be approved. Amendments are usually concluded by the end of the year following the request. State law generally prohibits the County from amending its Comprehensive Plan more than once per year.

Submission deadline. Suggestions must be received by the last business day of July for docketing. Suggestions received after that date will not be considered until the following year's docket.
