1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 5:00 pm, Wednesday, June 24, 2026, by the ESAB Chair, Bernie Alonzo

2. Roll Call /Attendance

Bernie Alonzo, Tom Skinner, Jess Hackler, Lavelle Pilon, Don Erickson, Mike Tamman

Excused: Scott Mangold

3. Public Comment

There was no public in attendance

4. Approval of Agenda

Approval of Agenda: Moved – Bernie, 2nd – Jess Hackler. All in favor, agenda approved.

5. Approval of Minutes

Approval of Minutes: Moved - Bernie, 2nd – Tom. All in favor, meeting minutes approved.

6. Reports

Administrative Report

Open Board Seat

Bernie asked the board to actively recruit potential new ESAB Board members. A small list of names was discussed. This is a board member ACTION item until the position is filled.

Other Items

A memorial letter for a board member or community member named Daryl was finalized and passed to staff for mailing; confirmed as sent (placed in outgoing mail queue). Sender noted county mail processing has been running slower than usual.

Brief procedural discussion on whether agenda approval is necessary under Robert's Rules. Chair confirmed it is required under the board's adopted procedures and elected to keep it brief and retained.

Maintenance Report

- Annual system-wide maintenance/testing (originally scheduled for June) has been pushed to July 6–8 due to a workplace injury reducing available crew (a staff member injured knee/leg in a fall; L&I claim involved).
- Recirculation pump: contacted DMH approximately 3–4 weeks prior for pickup/rebuild; DMH has not yet retrieved it.
- Final disposal pump: rebuild paused at the board's prior direction; pump will remain stored rather than rebuilt immediately, per discussion that seals can dry out if stored too long, but immediate rebuild was not deemed necessary.
- Lift carrier assembly (Superior Systems quote): Quote received for \$1,344. The quote is unclear whether \$1,344 was a per-unit or total price for the quoted quantity of 2. ESAB directed Mike to seek written clarification from the vendor before proceeding further, though a motion to proceed was still made and passed — see below.
- **Motion:** To have one set of carrier rails fabricated by Superior Systems per the quote provided (assuming the price is per each), with two additional carriers to be ordered if the first is confirmed to fit. Moved – Bernie, second Tom, all in favor, motion approved.
- Sludge depth findings: Recirc tank sludge reduced from 30 inches to 3 inches after a 2,000-gallon pump-out (previously approved/budgeted). Final disposal tank found to have approximately 5 inches of sludge (about 1,000 gallons), accumulated over an estimated 2 years.
- Discussion of options for the final disposal tank: full disposal/pump-out (quoted around \$525 for 1,000 gallons) versus transferring the sludge internally to the main tank using the existing transfer pump during regular clarifier-tank pumping (estimated additional cost in the range of \$100–250). Board leaned toward the lower-cost internal transfer option given the relatively small volume, pending confirmation that budget allows (confirmed as within the on-call services budget).

Operator Report

- Effluent pH sampled at 6.7 (within normal/expected range).
- Secondary tank pumped to main tank by Drain Doctor crew.
- Groundwater sampling equipment picked up from the county; sampling conducted on the 18th (first time this operator performed this specific sampling procedure).
- Lab results from a separate sampling event: 57% reduction in BOD, 79% reduction in TSS; fecal coliform results were within acceptable range.

- Groundwater sampling notes: continuity/conductivity meter could not be calibrated because calibration fluid had expired; wells were instead purged using a static-water-level/volume-based method. One well took longer than others to recharge. One well (located between two drain fields) showed visible discoloration possibly indicative of sludge intrusion; additional purging was performed at that well as a precaution. Results pending.
- Estimated cost for operator-performed groundwater sampling going forward: approximately \$1,000 per event, including supplies, required upto four times per year (quarterly per GWSP).
- UV system and recirc tank cleaning planned before end of month.
- Ecology has begun publishing sewage spill reports on a public-facing website per a same-day notice; operator was copied on the notice along with the county.
- Calibration fluid (both conductivity and pH) needs to be reordered; existing stock is expired or has been open too long to trust.

Special Projects Report

- UV system/equipment purchase: Purchase order proposal received from Trojan Technologies via Gray and Osborn. Contract drafted and sent for signature; contact is out of office until Friday.
- DOH has approved the engineer's report and plans.
- Ecology review of the engineer's report/plans still pending; follow-up requested by Dave Matthews (Ecology) and Erin Langley regarding county and Ecology coordination.
- Concern raised that drawings sent back as “completed” may only have an engineer's stamp added, without confirmation that previously requested red-line edits were incorporated. Board is awaiting confirmation/clarification and updated “issued for construction” drawings.
- Electrical contractor (“Dahl”) — draft contract sent; comments/recommendations requested by Tuesday, June 30.
- A 180-page specification document was confirmed as not being attached as a contract appendix in full; only relevant/non-boilerplate provisions were incorporated directly into the contract.
- *UNCLEAR: Status of whether conduit trenching pathway is included in the final contract drawings was raised as an open item from the prior month; addressed in an edit round but final confirmation still pending receipt of updated drawings.*

County Liaison Report

- Budget is currently tracking as expected for the year to date.
- Unanticipated/unbudgeted expense: groundwater sampling supplies, total \$688.84. Of this, \$474 has cleared (reflected in packet under

“Miscellaneous”); the remainder will post once the related charge ships and clears, expected to appear in next month’s report.

- No indication of being off-budget for the year.

7. Unfinished Business

Assessment Corrections / Refunds

- Board liaison met/communicated with a county treasurer's office contact (name uncertain, phonetically “Ayuma”) regarding refund obligations for erroneous assessments. Two relevant RCWs were referenced (included in packet): one establishing that refunds are owed when billing mistakes are identified, and a second stating that interest is owed on such refunds regardless of whether the affected party requests it.
- \$40 annual charge tied to a 2004 Skagit County resolution (loan #L0100017, original loan for design of the Edison Subarea Cleanwater District drain field improvements) was confirmed paid off in 2023, per the treasurer's office. The board had not been formally notified when the loan was paid off. The \$40 annual charge currently appearing on tax bills under “Edison Field Design” may be the same charge and should be discontinued going forward, with prior over-collected amounts refunded.
- *UNCLEAR: It was not resolved during the meeting which fund (Fund 150 vs. county general fund) the over-collected \$40/year landed in; this determination was assigned as a follow-up action.*
- Three parcels associated with a property described as “Moga” have been billed for sewer connection assessments despite not having a legitimate right to connect (development rights were reportedly relinquished as part of a private land transaction not binding on the board). Board consensus: these three parcels should be (1) notified they have no connection right, and (2) refunded amounts improperly collected from them in accordance with applicable RCWs.
- A related parcel transfer/“future share” issue (referred to as “Site 6”) was discussed at length regarding historical reassignment of a connection right between parcels; board agreed to revisit with the treasurer's office contact to clarify how the figures were originally calculated.
- Open question raised: whether “future shares” are legally tied to a specific property (per the treasurer's office contact's assertion) or are transferable, as the board has informally assumed. No governing ordinance/resolution could be identified confirming either position; board to follow up and may need to adopt a clarifying policy or amend SCC 12.64.
- A related question was raised about whether one specific connection (a former trailer site, since removed, with an inactive septic tank but no current plumbing) should continue to be billed for a full sewer connection given it has no active discharge. Not resolved; flagged as a separate issue to revisit.

- **Note:** Follow-up action: Chair to set up a separate conversation involving Tom Skinner, the Chair, Lavelle, and the treasurer's office contact to work through the loan/refund/Site 6 history in detail, expected before/at the July meeting.

Ecology Permit Considerations

- No board or county representative attended Ecology's water quality combined fund recipient training.
- Discussion of whether to pursue a Sewer Comprehensive Plan update for Edison, potentially including drain field upgrades identified in a prior capacity plan. Rough budget estimate discussed: approximately \$50,000–\$100,000 depending on scope.
- Clarified that Ecology has not formally directed the ESCWD to produce this plan; the board would be acting proactively / in anticipation of future requirements but should expect that it will be a requirement in the next permit cycle.
- Pursuing this work via grant funding would require contracting a grant writer, as county planning staff do not have capacity to perform this role.
- Board discussed inviting the Ecology permit manager (“Dave”) to a future meeting for guidance on available planning grants.

Contract Provisions and Specifications (Maintenance/Pumping Services Contract)

Note: Maintenance Provider left prior to this discussion

- Comments on the draft contract were due prior to this meeting; comments were received late from at least one board member, addressing minor wording corrections (e.g., “emergent” corrected to “emergency” response time; a redundant clause on packet page 5 removed; a typo on page 2 corrected).
- Discussion of whether periodic main tank cleanout (approximately every two years, should be itemized separately under on-call/special services rather than folded into routine monthly/quarterly/annual pricing. Consensus: classify as on-call/special services.
- Contract structure clarified: total contract not to exceed \$250,000 over its term; bidders will propose a flat monthly/quarterly/annual rate plus structure pricing for on-call services, with the combined total expected to stay within the \$250,000 ceiling. Selection will not be based on lowest total price alone (since all bids will reference the same ceiling) but on the proposed breakdown, experience, and overall proposal quality.
- Confirmed requirement: bidder must own (not subcontract) a vacuum/pump (“vac”) truck.
- Document title corrected: contract is not a “Small Public Works Project” under current county contracting guidelines; cover page to be updated.

8. New Business

Rate Model / Budget True-Up

- The rate-setting calendar shifted from October to June in the prior cycle, requiring estimation of certain non-contract expenses for July–September. Original estimate: \$6,600 (based on averaging first-half-year costs). Actual: approximately \$15,000, including roughly \$10,000 in pump rebuild costs.
- Open policy question: whether the ~\$10,000 pump rebuild overage should be absorbed by the reserve fund (Fund 150) rather than passed through to next year's assessments, with the remaining ~\$4,400 difference allocated based on what it represents. Deferred to next month pending Scott Mangold's input.
- Only two of an expected three quarterly FSC (food service commercial) loading tests have been completed to date; a third is expected in July. A prior fall test result has not yet been located. Current FSC-related billing figures in the packet are therefore likely understated.
- June county labor expense data not yet available (will be available after July 1 payroll run); county labor expenses in the packet currently only run through May.
- A data anomaly was flagged: November 2025 Social Security expense line shows \$3,200 versus a typical range of \$10–\$60/month, suspected data-entry error. Flagged for correction by the absent board member (Scott Mangold) or follow-up by staff.
- FSC-direct cost attribution: a \$904 Eurofins lab expense from March needs confirmation that it was correctly and fully attributed to FSC testing rather than general wastewater treatment testing.
- Effort-allocation percentage for FSC customers (currently modeled at 22% of contractor effort) was flagged by the absent board member as potentially too low given testing/sampling frequency (84 monthly meter readings, 32 quarterly tank samples, 49 sludge-judge readings, etc.); a revised figure of 25% was proposed for further discussion next month.
- Broader budgeting philosophy question raised: whether to continue budgeting based on prior-year actual costs (current practice) or to begin forecasting known/likely future large expenses (e.g., anticipated FSC testing costs, potential \$100,000 in future plan and report-writing costs) into the rate model in advance, versus relying on the reserve fund to absorb such costs as they arise. No decision made; deferred for full-board discussion next month.

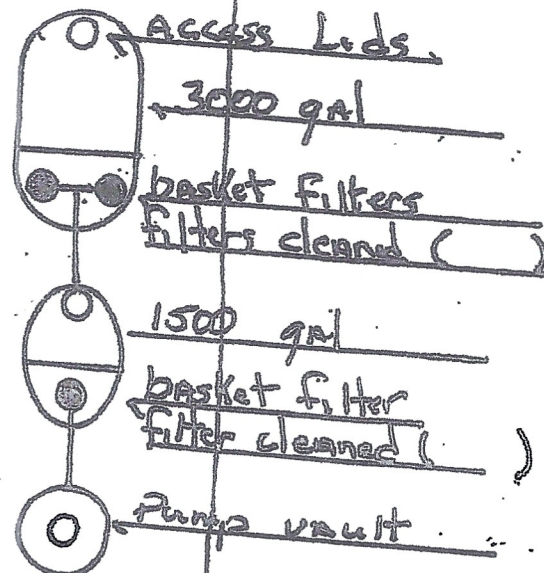

Edison WWTF Operators Report

June 4th, collected monthly samples for lab analysis, the flow was 6552 gallons, and the return rate was 9.1:1. The recirculating tank pH was 6.4, and effluent pH was 6.7. I inspected the site, was unable to see any ponding on the gravel filters by sight or smell and could hear the recirculating gravel filter pumps cycle. A visual inspection of the recirculating ball valve was found to be functioning correctly, and the facility is clean and well kept.

June 17th, the lab analysis showed a fecal count of <1.8 MPN/100ml and a 79% reduction in TSS and an 57% reduction in BOD. All were found to be within the expected range.

June 29th, cleaned the UV lamps, recirculating ball valve and a visual inspection of both appeared to be functioning correctly. The flow was 5700 gallons, and the return rate was 10.4:1, I was unable to observe any ponding on the gravel filters by sight or smell and could hear the recirculating gravel filter pumps cycle. I checked the solids level in the secondary settling tank and found 1.0' and .5', last cleaned on 6/8/26 by the maintenance contractor.

The inspection revealed that your tank requires pumping due to the combined level of sludge (settled waste) and scum (floating waste) in the tank. Keeping all tanks in good working order serves to keep our sewer system healthy and operating within the limits of our permit.

Your system includes a pump to transfer wastewater from your STEP tank to the sewer system main line. Due to the complexity of the pumped systems, the pumping will be performed by the system maintenance contractor, The Drain Doctor.

The Drain Doctor will invoice you directly for the pumping service. Please note that since 2025, pumping charges are invoiced at the time of service rather than included in the following year's assessment.
