To its continuing efforts to protect riparian resources and to improve customer service by expanding the availability of flood risk data, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has released the 03 Flood Data product. Designed to support FEMA's response and recovery activities and flood insurance policy-making initiatives, 03 Flood Data will be used in riparian management, systems analysis, and risk assessment activities. The product contains a set of information derived from water Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) data. While the 03 Flood Data were developed to support floodplain management activities, they do not replace the paper FIRMs.
