My name is Arsen Mourning. My pronouns are he/him. I am 14 years old.

When I was 8 ½ years old, my grandfather was walking our 7 year old border collie / retriever mix dog. Coal. Coal had been part of our family since I was two, and I had no memories of a time without him. He was healthy and was expected to live many more happy years. He weighed around 50 pounds.

My grandfather was walking in the Anacortes Community Forest Lands, and had gone down a branching path with nothing to indicate that it was no longer part of the ACFL. There was no closed fencing and no private property signs.

He was shocked when he saw a man with wolves on leashes. Wild animals on ordinary dog leashes. They easily broke loose and killed my dog.

I saw the corpse that day after school. I was in 3rd grade. I pet him under his ear, his favorite spot, and my hand came back bloody.

That sweet, kind dog was the backbone of our family. Originally trained to be a guide dog, we adopted him when he was one year old. He was perfectly trained and was always there when I needed him.

The trauma of that unexpected loss was what started my descent into a mental health crisis that has lasted to this day, even as I prepare to enter high school.

I've struggled heavily with depression and suicide, issues that were first triggered by that loss. I now am often afraid to walk our new four year old dog in the woods I've grown up with because of this. I've had panic attacks triggered by the sound of wolf calls. The image of seeing my dear dog, mangled and gorey, has haunted me ever since. His murder was a core scarring in my childhood.

I carried an anger towards wolves as a species for several years. But eventually, I realized: there should be no blame put onto wild animals who simply acted on predatory instincts. The blame falls entirely to the Predators of the Heart program, who did not clearly mark their property, did not have adequate fences, and put dangerous animals on leashes they were able to easily break out of. They have proven to be capable of escape.

Wolves are wild animals. It's cruel and unsafe to treat them as pets. No matter how well they are trained, they have proven to be prone to violent behaviors. For an organization who claims to preserve wildlife, they keep wild animals in pet-like situations. Animals that could so easily kill a beloved pet, or human, should not be cuddled or manhandled. They should run free in a safe environment, not be walked on flimsy leashes.

For the sake of the wolves, the people who visit them, the animals they run into, and the little kids whose lives can be shattered by them, I urge you to question the validity of a group who does not have proper safety and who attempt to defy predatory instincts and put wolves in an unnatural and abhorrent environment. They claim their animals are trained to be non-violent, but they killed an animal who did not bark at them or threaten them. Imagine if, instead of a 7 year old dog, next time, it's a 7 year old human instead.

Hiking in Cranberry Lake Park in Anacortes, WA with my son's family dog a medium sized 7 year old neutered male Coltriever (Golden Retriever/Border Collie mix), on a leash. My intent was to hike a new, to me, area in the south part of the park. We entered the park by the water tower on the east side and hiked south of Cranberry Lake to trail 10 south, I had planned to take trail 118 up to the crest of the hill. Met another hiker, Robert Jeppersen, on the trail and we talked briefly about wildlife in the park and his new book. He gave me his card. A few minutes later, met a lady with her dog. I asked her about the trail and she said that it is steep but that she had just come down.

Turned right on trail 118 and soon came to a chain link gate on the trail. There were two trails a short distance before the gate, but neither was marked. The one on my right looked to be the major trail and fit my mental picture of my route. I knew that some of the park trails exited onto other entrances so was not concerned. There was a short chain link fence at the bottom of the trail with a gate that was open. I was just past the end of the short fence when a man called from above that I was on private property and that I needed to go back. I apologized and asked if he knew if the other trail was 118. He did not know. He further said that the animals with him were wolves. Both his animals were on leashes. I turned back toward the park trail. The male wolf, Max, got away from the owner and grabbed my dog by the neck. The owner came down and we tried to separate the animals. He tied the wolf's leash to the end post of the short fence, but he did not release his hold on my dog. At that point, the female, Kakoa, also broke loose and grabbed my dog by the back. A younger couple came down the hill and helped us separate the animals; however, my dog was already dead.

I called my daughter-in-law about 11 o'clock and the other owner gave her instructions to his private zoo up the hill. He also arranged for four young men to come help move our dog to the car.

I was only a short distance from the park boundary at the time. The trail that I assume was 118 was only a few feet away at the time so the lady with her dog that had come up the trail a few minutes earlier would have been in similar danger if the timing had been slightly different

The owner told my daughter-in-law that they had the wolves out for a photo op and gave the name of the park as: Predators of the Heart, 4709 Welch Lane, Anacortes.

I received a call from my father-in-law Mike Mourning at 10:46 am on Thursday, September 28, 2017 about my dog Coal. He said, "We've got a problem. Coal's been attacked and I don't think he's going to make it." I asked where he was and he handed the phone over to another man who told me they were at 4709 Welch Lane in Anacortes, and to follow the signs to the airbnb. I left immediately, arrived in 5-6 minutes, and drove around the property for a while looking for my father-in-law, but couldn't find anyone. My cell phone had little to no reception so I couldn't reach him either. Finally I saw a group of people (an older white man, a younger Asian woman, and another person or two) walking down a path with what looked like very large dogs. A man with gray hair and a shirt that indicated his name was Dave spoke to me. Dave told me that my father-in-law must have taken a wrong turn off the public trails and ended up on his property. Dave said his wolves had attacked my dog and that he (Coal) was already dead. (Prior to this news I was rushing to get my dog to the vet for emergency care.) He said that he was pulling the leash with all his might but that he couldn't control the wolf or get him off of my dog. And then the other wolf joined in on the attack.

He told me to wait and he would send some people to lead me to my dead dog and father-in-law and they would help us bring Coal back down to my car. After a long while, four young men arrived and did just that.

The above information is true to the best of my knowledge and was freely given. No threats or promises have been made against me or to me in order to make this statement. I certify under the penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of Washington that the forgoing is true and correct.

On 9/28/17 I was informed briefly by the Anacortes Animal Control about a possible attack where two or three wolves had attacked a dog near or on the hiking trails in Anacortes.

On 9/29/17 I was informed that this incident had actually taken place on DAVE COLEBURN'S property at 4709 Welch Lane. Officer NYBO did go out to the Anacortes Forest land and saw there were no trespassing signs posted on DAVE COLEBURN'S property and that there was a chain link fence. There was a trail marker sign missing so they put in a new sign and will be putting in big logs between DAVE COLEBURNS property and the trail property. The trail is very well worn in between DAVE'S property and the trail land. She mentioned according to the information she had there was a photo shoot going which is why DAVE was out with the wolves.

Before speaking with the victims, the MOURNINGS, I looked up DAVE COLEBURN'S Facebook account and his website and saw that he is now offering photo opportunities where people are paying \$150 to come out and take photos of his wolves and meet the wolves. He also has an Air BNB where he is offering this photo shoot opportunity.

On 9/29/17 I was able to speak with MICHAEL MOURNING, the father of the owner. MICHAEL MOURNING was the one walking the dog when this attack occurred. He forwarded me his statement where he states that he was walking his son's family's dog, a medium sized, 7 year old neutered male, Labrador / border collie mix on a leash. He was trying a new to him hike in the south part of the park. He had planned to hike trail #118 up the crest of the hill. He turned right on trail #118 and came to a chain link gate on the trail. There were two trails a short distance before the gate but neither was marked. The one on the right looked to be the major trail and fit his mental picture of his route. He said there was a short chain link fence at the bottom of the trail with a gate that was open.

He was just past the end of the short fence when a man called from above that he was on private property and he needed to go back. He apologized and asked if he knew where the trail 118 was. The male did not. He said that the man said the animals were wolves that he had with him and both animals were on leashes. He said he turned toward the park trail and the male wolf, according to MICHAEL got away from the owner and grabbed the dog by the neck. He said the owner, he later identified on the website, DAVE COLEBURN who was also wearing a nametag with the name DAVE kept yelling the name MAX over and over again when the dog got away from him and grabbed onto the dogs neck.

The owner came down to try to separate the animals. They tied the wolf's leash to the end of a short fence, but he still did not release. According to MICHAEL the wolf just held on to his dog's neck and did not let go. He said the female dog KAKOA who he identified on the website, and also heard the name being called, broke loose from a woman who was holding onto the leash and grabbed the dog by the back. Apparently a younger couple came down the hill and helped them separate the animals. However, the dog was already dead. He said there were four males who helped moved the dog to the car as he called MEG MOURNING to come pick up the deceased dog. The dog was transported to Fidalgo Animal Hospital where they will be performing a necropsy today, 9/29/17 or tomorrow 9/30/17.

According to MICHAEL he was very concerned about DAVE COLEBURN having a heart attack during this incident because as he was very worked up and kept saying he could not have this. When I asked him if he viewed the no trespassing signs, he said that he was trying to pay attention to looking for the trail marker signs and that he did see the no trespassing signs and the sign on the gate. However, he was paying attention to looking for the trail marker and admits he made a mistake and did not pay attention to the no trespassing signs. He said he was not injured and he was never threatened by the wolf. He said there was an Asian woman who was holding onto KAKOA and that he had heard she had gotten rope burns from the wolf pulling away from her, and that they were doing a photo shoot.

He said the incident took approximately 5-10 minutes. After speaking with him, I was able to speak with MEG, the daughter in law and the owner of Cole. She said that Cole is a summit assistance dog who was released after one year in the program. She said the dog is currently 7.75 years old. He was a super excellent dog, a border collie/retriever mix.

After reviewing all of the laws, I found that I could declare the wolves as potentially dangerous for jeopardizing the safety of domestic animals. I also sent an email to the civil attorneys asking for more information on DAVID COLEBURN'S status regarding the wolves and other animals on his property.

I also called Fidalgo Animal Medical Center to communicate with them about a necropsy. I will wait for their call back. No further action.

On 10/04/17 while reviewing the photographs sent by the MOURNING'S and the photographs sent by OFFICER NYBO, from the Anacortes Police Department, I found that there were no "no trespassing" signs posted on COLEBURN'S property in the pictures that the victim took while waiting for the dog owner to arrive.

I also spoke with MICHAEL MOURNING, and while talking with him and reviewing the photographs, it was clear that the "no trespassing" signs he saw were actually the "no trespassing" signs on the WELCH'S property that is just past COLEBURN'S property.

I later viewed the photographs that OFFICER NYBO had taken later that same day of the incident 09-28-17 around 1630 hours, and there were two new "no trespassing" signs posted on the property that were not in the earlier photos.

Also during my conversation with MICHAEL MOURNING, one of his concerns was that on the website it does show DAVID COLEBURN taking KOKOA to school and many times there are service dogs a school as well. He was worried about the safety of the dogs as well as the safety of the children in these events.

He also said he has put up no trespassing signs.

He did inform me that there was one day BONNIE BOWERS and her two dogs had accidentally gone onto his property and there were some horses. He said that the same two wolves there have been pictures of them licking professional baseball teams faces. He said that the Texas Rangers were just out at his property visiting the wolves and that these are not potentially dangerous animals. He didn't understand how it could happen.

On 01/02/18 DAVE COLEBURN, the Sheriff, and I were able to meet in the Sheriff's Office. After our meeting the Sheriff did find that both wolves are not to be declared as Potentially Dangerous as he did not feel they met the criteria to be declared because he did not feel there was a tendency to attack as this was the first known attack.

Later in the day I did call MEG MOURNING, the owner of the dog that was killed. I did inform her of the Sheriff's decision. She was very upset and wanted to know who to contact to make it so that in her words "a murder would not happen again so that nobody else would be murdered on his property." I informed her that the Commissioners were the ones who could change the laws in Skagit County. I did walk her through both the Dangerous Dog and Potentially Dangerous Dog laws in Skagit County. I also walked her through the Wild and Potentially Dangerous Animal Laws in Skagit County and informed her of the exemption that the County has recognized to allow him to have the animals he currently has. I also gave her the phone number to the Sheriff's Office, as the Sheriff was willing to talk with her as well.

City concerned about wolves from wildlife refuge near forest lands

The city posted warning signs in the Community Forest Lands in December informing the public that a wolf had escape nearby wildlife refuge in October, and a wolf had been captured in the ACFL in 2012. A wolf killed a hiker's dog on wildli private property in a separate September incident. The signs were intended to be educational and address public safety City Forest Lands Manager Jonn Lunsford.

Incidents involving wolves from a Fidalgo Island wildlife refuge have prompted the City of Anacortes to put up warning signs in the Anacortes Community Forest Lands in an effort to increase public safety. In September, wolves from Predators of the Heart killed a hiker's dog on wildlife refuge private property, and in October, a wolf escaped its enclosure and went onto a neighbor's property, according to copies of reports from the Skagit County Sheriff's Office.

Predators of the Heart is a 10-acre wooded wildlife preserve home to wolves, cougars, reptiles, birds and other exotic animals focused on conservation and education, according to its website. It is located in a residential neighborhood in unincorporated Skagit County and is adjacent to the forest lands.

A Dec. 26 city notice posted online and at four locations near the southern end of the Cranberry Lake area alerted trail users that a wolf had escaped onto private property in October, in addition to a 2012 incident in which a wolf from the refuge was captured in the city forest lands.

In October, the wolf jumped over a 7-foot electric fence and traveled onto a neighbor's property, the report states. The wolf remained on Predators of the Heart property for the majority of time, but the animal was not secured for 18 hours, according to the report.

The city's main concern was public safety and notification, said Forest Lands Manager Jonn Lunsford.

"(The Parks Department) talked about it internally with city staff, public safety staff and City Council, and we acted on it just after Christmas to make the public aware that in the area, just what the signs say, that a wolf had gotten out so the public could be informed to make the recreational choice that's right for them," Lunsford said.

The city has also tried to clarify the trail boundary between the forest lands and Predators of the Heart, including building a natural barrier of logs and branches between the properties and putting up an "approaching private property" sign, Lunsford said.

The goal was to help hikers stay on-trail after the hiker whose dog was killed by wolves took a wrong turn onto the wildlife refuge property in September.

In a witness statement provided with the sheriff's report, the hiker wrote that he was walking a family dog on Trail 118 in the forest lands and came to an intersection with two unmarked trails. He turned onto a trail that led him past a short fence and onto the refuge property.

Predators of the Heart owner Dave Coleburn, who was nearby with two wolves on leashes and a group of guests, warned the man that he was on private property and that he had wolves with him.

Coleburn, who has presented his wild animals at schools and public events for 20 years, recently started an Airbnb "experience" that allows guests to walk and take pictures with wolves in the woods on his property, according to his Airbnb page. The guests were doing a photo shoot with the wolves when the hiker became lost, the sheriff's report states.

One wolf broke away and bit the hiker's dog, and a second wolf then broke away and joined the attack. Coleburn and others in the group tried separate the animals, but the wolves killed the dog, according to the statement.

Anacortes Police Department Animal Control initially responded to the incident and confirmed it took place on private property in the county, not in the city forest lands.

"It was unfortunate what happened with the dog, but I think the most important thing to know is that it happened on our property. It did not happen in the park lands," Coleburn told the Anacortes American.

Ever since the city posted the signs, Coleburn said he has received calls from community members concerned about loose wolves. He said the city's signs have caused people to spread rumors.

A wolf has only escaped its enclosure one other time in 20 years and had never before attacked a dog, he said.

In February 2012, a wolf jumped out of its enclosure and was captured by Animal Control in the forest lands, according to a police report.

Coleburn said the refuge is spending \$40,000 on new fences and enclosures.

"We have perimeter fences, underground fences, electric fences and locked gates," he said. "Nobody else has the security we have."

In a letter to neighbors after the incident, Coleburn wrote that wolves are naturally timid and "at no point did we sense a threat to our neighbors or animals."

He said he felt bad the dog was killed and doesn't blame the hiker because there were no "private property" or "no trespassing" signs posted at the time. He has since added signs to prevent hikers from wandering onto this property.

He also put in place other safety measures such as better collars and leashes and requiring the wolves to be tethered to their handler's belt so they can't break away, he said.

"This was a one-time incident," Coleburn said.

He said all the money from the Airbnb business is going back to make the facility safer.

People from all over the world come to Anacortes every week to take part in the "Wolf Encounter" experience, which has over 500 online reviews, he said.

"We're the No. 1 (Airbnb experience) in the world," Coleburn said. "And you don't get to be there by being irresponsible."

One recent guest wrote, "Dave has created an incredible sanctuary for his wolves and other rescued animals, and he provides an in-depth experience with them and education about them."

Another guest said, "The Predators of the Heart experience is an extraordinary opportunity to have hands-on interaction with gentle playful wolves. Our guide and host "Dave" has an honest compassion for these beautiful misunderstood animals and shares his knowledge willingly."

Friends of the Forest Education and Outreach Director Denise Crowe said that the organization stands behind the city's decision to post the warning signs.

"We were deeply saddened by the initial incident in the woods and concerned about the potential for other incidents like them to occur," Crowe said. "We fully support the city's efforts in educating the public about the operation bordering the forest lands in an effort to increase public safety."

Coleburn has faced concern from community members before.

His neighbors previously questioned whether the wildlife refuge belongs in a residential neighborhood and pushed for a change in county law to make ownership of many potentially dangerous wild animals illegal, except in facilities such as a state-defined wildlife sanctuary or accredited zoo. The neighbors said they wanted to see the animals moved to a legal facility or to a county that allowed them.

Skagit County passed an ordinance and sued Coleburn when he failed to comply. But the county later dropped the lawsuit after finding that while county code prohibits ownership of the animals, there is a state legal exemption for animals exhibited at state fairs, said Skagit County Prosecuting Attorney Rich Weyrich.

"We asked (the judge) to dismiss (the complaint) because he wasn't in violation of state law," Weyrich said.

After the September incident involving the dog attack, the county considered declaring the wolves "potentially dangerous dogs," but after Skagit County Sheriff Will Reichardt spoke with Coleburn, he decided the animals didn't fit the criteria.

A "potentially dangerous dog" is a dog with a known propensity, tendency or disposition to attack, or who bites a domestic animal off the owner's property, according to county code.

This attack occurred on the owner's property, Reichardt said. Whether a wolf or hybrid wolf automatically has a tendency to attack would be a question for the county commissioners to decide, he said.
"(Coleburn) is trying to be a responsible owner," the sheriff said. "I cautioned him that he needs to take steps so this doesn't happen because the forest lands runs right up against his property."

The owners of the dog killed by wolves said they believe the owner of Predators of the Heart should completely contain his animals.

"We would like a real fence completely enclosing wild animals like a zoo would have," said Dave Mourning, whose father was walking the dog when it was killed.

Meg Mourning said the short fence separating the public forest lands from the wildlife refuge woods near Trail 118 is inadequate, and that signs won't stop a wolf from getting out.

"The law should at least require that these animals are kept away from the public," she said. "It's almost four times worse because it's directly against Anacortes trails."

My name is Meg Mourning.

On September 28, 2017, my father-in-law Mike Mourning took our family dog, Coal, on what was to be his last "walk in the woods" in the Anacortes Community Forest Lands (ACFL). They both loved these walks and took them often while the grandparents were visiting us here in Anacortes from their home in Virginia. Coal was a very good dog, having been trained for the first year of his life to serve as a guide dog by Summit Assistance Guide Dogs. Summit had trained him to be a beta – not an alpha – and he was never aggressive, and Grandpa always kept him leashed.

Grandpa and Coal were on new-to-them ACFL Trail 118 and came to a place where the trail forked near some fence segments that were connected to nothing on either side (see Attachment B). Grandpa took the wrong trail, having no way of knowing that he was now on private property which turned out to belong to Predators of the Heart (POTH).

Dave Coleburn from POTH called down to Grandpa that he was on private property and that he had wolves on leashes with him. Before Grandpa could retreat, first one and then another wolf broke away from the people holding their leashes and attacked Coal the Dog. The two people who were holding the wild animals on leashes sustained serious rope burns from the leashes being forcefully tugged away from them. They tried to pull the wolves off Coal, but they were unable to save his life.

POTH had the wolves out on leases, on their unfenced and unmarked property which abuts the public ACFL trials, in order to take pictures of paying customers playing with wild animals in the woods. Read that again. It is insane that POTH has been allowed to do something as crazy as that *ever*, much less for decades.

POTH has argued that they had (a few) signs up stating that it is Private Property. Look again at Attachment B. All the signs in the world would not have prevented the wolves from moving the extra 20 feet to murder our family dog on public property. Plus, wolves can't read.

Our children were then in 3rd grade and kindergarten and were absolutely wrecked by this preventable tragedy. We naively assumed that Skagit County would make sure POTH was held accountable and they would either be shut down, or they would be unable to operate until safe and sane precautions were taken. Real zoos and legitimate animal sanctuaries must ensure that humans (and family pets) are safe from the wild animals they force into captivity.

It is bewildering and disheartening that POTH "got away" with murdering our family dog, because of the technicality that the attack happened on their property, so very close to the public forest trails. We urge you to shut down POTH immediately.

Attached are several documents we ask you to review while considering this matter:

Attachment A: Photo of Coal the Dog playing in our backyard with my two young children and their grandfather Mike Mourning.

Attachment B: Photo of Coal the Dog just after he was killed by POTH's wolves, clearly showing that the few segments of fencing that existed were totally unable to contain any animals, much less wild animals. It also shows how the two well-worn walking paths forked without any kind of signage indicating which path was Anacortes Community Forest Lands and which was private property. Please also note the lack of any warning signs or no trespassing signs.

I am strongly opposed to the expansion of this facility due to the owners' continued lack of regard for the safety of the community and their inability to keep their animals contained and under control. I think it is outrageous that we still have sections of the Anacortes Forest Lands system which require signposting as "potentially unsafe for use" due to their close proximity to the Predators facility. And I find it infuriating that the owners of Predators are never held accountable for the times when their animals get loose and menace people who try to use the public trails, nor are their dangerous animals confiscated when they escape and kill domestic pets.

Predators of the Heart is not a "wildlife sanctuary" (as they like to bill themselves). Wildlife sanctuaries house actual wildlife, while Predators' "wolves" are domesticated dog/wolf hybrids who have no place in the wild. Nor does Predators of the Heart serve any manner of conservation purpose, as again, their "wolves" are not purebred examples of their species at all, but rather they have been hybridized with domestic dogs, rendering their genetic contribution to any captive breeding program worthless.

We are strongly opposed to allowing the existence of this wild animal facility in it's current location, or anywhere on Fidalgo Island. Not only does Predators of the Heart lie adjacent to ACFL hiking trails that we use frequently, which creates a public safety hazard when there are animal escapes, but it is also very close to our residential property, which creates a safety hazard for our family.

Our property on San Juan Blvd is the second or third property an escaped animal from Predators of the Heart would encounter should it follow the private road (closed portion of San Juan Blvd) up the hill from the compound. I estimate this distance to be less than 1000 meters, or roughly 1/2mile.

Putting aside concern for ourselves and our dog who is outside on our property many days a week, we don't think Predators of the Heart is safe enough to merit the public safety risk. Regardless of the published record of "only a few" escaped animals, it will only take one event to create a tragic encounter with a wild animal. From my first tour hosted under previous leadership to my most recent tour just prior to their shutdown, I have witnessed extensive improvements since Ashley took the reins. This includes reconfiguring enclosures to allow more space for the animals, adding new enclosures for the smaller mammals, implementing better husbandry of the cougars, creating supplemental curriculum for public schools through a virtual education platform, and participating in their first granted wish through the Make-A-Wish Foundation.

I have visited sanctuaries and participated in animal encounters at zoos around the world, seeing both good and bad examples. Predators of the Heart has taken incredible care to create a wolf experience done the right way. They know their animals well and do not force them to do anything they are not comfortable doing. The Ambassador wolves, in particular, really enjoy visitors, and I am sure Max is missing his belly rubs. Visitors and wolves have a choice whether or not they want to have closer interaction with each other. By showing this mutual respect, no one is forced outside of their comfort zone. I have never felt anything other than safe when I have visited their sanctuary.

To address any of the noise complaints, I can say that in watching their live streams over the past year and a half, I have heard various noises, including wild coyotes yipping, the neighbors' ATVs and dogs barking as well as jets flying overhead, none of which is coming from the sanctuary. I've rarely heard the wolves howl, but it is certainly a magical serenade when they do.

Comments : I had the pleasure of visiting POTH in person, after Ashley Carr took over as Director. At no point in time did I feel unsafe or that I was in danger. In fact, when I first entered the property, I felt like I was entering a very secure facility. I did not know what to expect, but I was surprised with what I received. From the very beginning of the tour, everything was handled with extreme professionalism, and a no nonsense attitude. My guided tour included viewing and learning facts about the animals that were not nocturnal, no animals were forced into being viewed, and there was zero interaction with any of the rescued animals by our visiting group. We were able to spend a short time with the conservation wolf dog ambassadors, and again at no time did I feel in danger, the rules were very well laid out by our hosts, and the experience was incredible.

I suffer from PTSD, and this tour/interaction with wolf dogs was a gift from a friend, in hopes that it would help me. It did.

A few months later I heard the news that POTH was closed do to a permitting issue, and I like hundreds (possibly thousands) of others assumed it would be a quick resolution. I checked back often to see if it had been resolved, and was disappointed each time.

After a couple of more months, when I heard Ashleys plea for help, I decided to answer that call, and get more involved, as what they had provided for me was something very special, it was peace in my heart and mind.

At this juncture I began to contact local businesses to donate for a raffle, almost every single one I called, donated without question, also stating they hoped they (POTH) could re-open soon, and that they were surprised the permitting was taking so long. These businesses benefitted massively from POTH being in business, as nearly all guests of POTH came to Anacortes from out of town. Their closure has lost millions in revenue for the city, and its local businesses.

In January of 2023, Ashley invited me to join the Board of Directors. I accepted. Having learned more at this point about the previous leadership, and the direction Ashley was moving with the organization, I wanted to be more involved.

As a board we decided a name change would be appropriate to signal these changes to the community, and to help convey that things were indeed in the hands of capable individuals who cared about the facility and the community. POTH became Because We Matter.

During these last few months, while continuing to assist with fundraising, I have come to see that this organization seems to have been targeted, unfairly by several groups, in almost all cases citing issues that pervious leadership was responsible for. Some even stating that the encounter they provide is cruel to their animals, and somehow makes them a subpar organization, although their rescued animals are not subject to interaction beyond that of their handlers.

At this time, I would like to point out that, just last week I paid for a rhinoceros encounter at the AZA accredited Woodland park zoo, with my 3 & 4 year old children, and have been paying for similar experiences for over a decade at the WPZ. (Giraffe feeding, penguin feeding) Which they offer on a daily basis, for hundreds to enjoy each week. The only differences between the two being that BWM does not offer experiences to children, or feeding of its animals during the private tours.

BWM (POTH) has never claimed their wolves are purebred wolf, they are always referred to as Wolf Dogs, or Wolf Dog Ambassadors.

I'd like to note that this has been a very emotional process for me, being on the board of directors, seeing all of the things this organization has been through simply to continue to care for the animals.

Being involved in the fight for these animals lives is something I passionately believe in, but I could have never anticipated that funding for the care of live animals would be suspended for such a long duration of time, with their lives hanging in the balance.

To withhold this permit any longer, which simply allows adults to visit the property, would indeed be a great injustice to this organization and the community. I am beyond disheartened that it has taken so long, but grateful that the day has finally come to be heard, and thankful for the opportunity to comment.

In closing, I would like to state that I do not believe BWM (POTH) should be held to a higher standard than what the USDA & AZA regulations outline for safety of a facility.

I believe this organization is a massive asset for the community, and if further actions are required to meet the permit standards, they should be granted a temporary permit to operate, as their current facility is very secure.

Additionally, continuing to ask the community to fund, after an 18 month wait for this permit is excessive, but the fact that the community has stood up to fund this operation should be noted, and speak to the importance and integrity of this organization.

Furthermore, once able to resume operations, BWM intends to resume offering programs such as Make A Wish, and begin their Military outreach for those that suffer from PTSD, which once again are incredible assets for this community.

I've met its wild inhabitants. (However, I am not personally acquainted with anyone involved in this proceeding.)

I think this facility provides an important service and this is a good location for it. These wild animals have been put in a bad situation by humans and they deserve a sanctuary. And the facility serves an important function of wildlife education. The physical interaction with wild animals is in regards to two "ambassador" animals which were already habituated to human interactions and therefore is not inappropriate.

I know that there have been some incidents, but the current owner has taken steps to make the facility more secure and complying with other requirements. And this is despite the fact that the cost of these legal proceedings is cutting into the budget that could better be allocated to addressing those issues.

There is a lot of misinformation about and unfounded fear of wolves. While they do pose a danger to pets, healthy wolves don't attack humans like cougars do. Wild wolves generally avoid humans. These animals are well-fed, secured, and several incidents, over decades, and under different management, should not be used to condemn the facility.

I am a dog owner. I know just how devastated I would be if a wild animal killed my dog. There may be some hard feelings and bad blood, and maybe justifiably, but just because a few people hate something or had a bad experience doesn't mean it should be completely eliminated. There are many people living here and our voices should count too.

We are surrounded by coyotes. They make much more noise and present a greater danger to pets than anything at the sanctuary. And I know that I can't leave my dog outside unsupervised. And yet, I would not want to live without them. The wildlife on Fidalgo Island is part of what makes it such a

wonderful place to live. I fall asleep to the sound of coyotes yipping, and it makes me grateful to live here. I don't think we should try to change this town to be like the places everyone left to come here.

I have visited the Predators of the Heart (POTH) property twice, for their tour and wolf encounters. I am eager to return, and to bring many people with me.

The property is well-cared for, as are the animals, and the security of the property never gave me a second of concern. The education provided by the staff (who are clearly dedicated and passionate) was thorough, entertaining, and very informative. The overall experience was life-changing, hence why I've attended twice and would like to return again and again.

In a world that consistently pushes animal and nature to the side, these resources are constantly used up and mistreated; yet POTH seeks to protect and preserve them, a necessary step in protecting the planet from the climate disasters we face and disruption to the ecosystems that inhabit this world. In a world that sees people increasingly at odds with one another, POTH seeks to bring closer to nature and to each other through education and exploration. While there is an inherent risk to caring for some of the animals on the property (and sadly some family pets paid that price), we do not ban vehicles or harmful chemicals from that area and even cursory research shows untold damage done to animals and nature within Skagit by careless actions of humans (already there have been 10 motor vehicle fatalities in Skagit Co in 2023, according to the Skagit County Coroner (a URL cannot be provided on this form)). Moreover, many of the animals cared for on that property are there because of human carelessness or ignorance. Yet, we punish the animals, and their caretakers, and the would-be visitors by shutting POTH down.

Any person who sees pictures of me with the wolves or near the porcupine, sloths, or other wonderful animals is immediately energized to ask about this magical place, and I encourage each to go and see for themselves.

I have run for Congressional office, served on city diversity boards, obtained a PhD in forensic psychology, run a successful private practice, have two non-profits (both focusing on nature and animals), worked in a prison/group home/mental health programs, and have dedicated most of my adult life to improving the world around me in anyway I can, for the betterment of all living things that inhabit it - never for personal gain beyond a standard livelihood - and I know that many statements will be spoken, read, and heard regarding the matter here. If POTH is to close, irreparable damage will be done to the animals and people attached to it. We will lose out on education and experience that is becoming rarer to find. And we will have a difficult time reclaiming any of this if it is decided to try again.

Reactions seek to shut down this endeavor (if the news stories are to be believed), but again we do not shut down bars, cigarette factories, or fast food restaurants despite the damage they do. We continue to use vehicles that pollute and damage the environment. The list could go on but yet despite the damage from these, and other, human inventions and actions, many of them continue with full support from communities. Yet, places like Predators of the Heart seek to do the highest amount of good in a difficult situation.

It is imperative that we do not simply shut down a place like this, but work together to strengthen it. Restorative justice is a strong and effective legal mechanism and if we apply the same ideology here, a community could come together to support and uplift Predators of the Heart, not condemn it and move forward without any gain.

I follow Because We Matter Exotic Rescue on social media, and regularly attend live streams from the facility with April Grossruck and her team. I believe that the rescue can be a win-win scenario for your area and for the animals.

When doors to the facility are opened to the public, tourism and a general flow of visitors will provide an opportunity for businesses in the area. Overnight guests will go out into the community for meals and activities. Travellers will stop at gas stations and shops along the way. Furthermore, the Rescue is not a zoo, and attendance is controlled. The roads will not be overrun with vehicles.

A positive relationship with the Rescue may be beneficial to the area, similar to marketing, since the Rescue hosts live stream and are able to talk about the vacation opportunities nearby. Supporters would be compelled to visit Skagit County if they could access the Rescue and make a vacation out of it.

I would like to point out that the Rescue is fairly insular and few neighbours surround it. Houses are acres away. It is my understanding that wolf howls sit between 90 and 115 decibels, while the average domestic dog bark sits at 120 decibels. Neighbouring dogs run along the fenced boundary of the Rescue, barking at times, which is technically more of a nuisance than the wolves themselves. Admittedly subjective, the rhythmic, melodious sound of howling is pleasurable, versus the annoying bark of dogs. The wolves also need a reason to howl, and most of the time, they are silent. I do not believe that the "nuisance howling" argument is legitimate, and is no more of an issue than a hobby farm would be.

Lastly, it is important to acknowledge the charitable nature of the Rescue. It does a public service, taking on wild animals that people attempt to tame, and safeguarding genetic material that provides a deeper gene pool for wolf conservation. If one is unaware of the importance of wolves and other apex predators, it can be observed through the story of Yellowstone National Park. National

Geographic has a beautiful video detailing the impact the reintroduction of grey wolves has had on the ecosystem there (titled Wolves of Yellowstone). North America needs wolves!

Without the permission for the Rescue to open its doors to visitors and guests, it is unlikely to survive. Therefore, many of the animals are unlikely to survive. Skagit County will lose representation as a tourist attraction to animal lovers, and a bitter taste will be left in thousands of mouths. But if this office allows the Rescue to carry on, there will be support and windfalls, and good things to come.

I am based in the UK but I watch the live streams that are just amazing, from my observations I have to disagree with the appeal against Ashley and her team. After reading each point of the appeal I would like to note a few areas that I have noticed. With regards to the continuous howling from the wolf dogs as an example over a minimum of the last 2 weeks during the live stream there has not been any howling happening. With regards to a number of vehicles using the driveway causing a nuisance obviously whilst you have had the Sanctuary closed for 18 months it's only been staff vehicles. When open yes there are approximately 7-14 vehicles when the amazing tours are running but I personally don't see this as excessive to be honest. With regards to the noise on the site there have been a good few times that I have noticed there are dogs continuously barking in the background, this can only be local to the site as the dogs on site were not barking at the time. I did make a note that on these days luckily with the site so secure the wolf dogs did not raise their heads or react in anyway whatsoever.

The wolf dogs howling is such a calming sound and I would urge you to visit the sanctuary yourself to see the wolf dogs and other animals in a habitat that is as true to their natural surroundings as possible.

After reviewing the evidence provided I noticed on the maps that there is a vast array of forestry but I could only really notice 1 neighbour that is within close proximity to the sanctuary. I also noticed on the maps and on the lives that animals are very secure with hot fencing, also a security measure in place incase a wolf dog did get out off the enclosure, there are additional areas around the fencing so they would need to escape a minimum of 2 enclosures to get out. They also have 6 sided nighttime enclosures to keep them safe & secure.

On a personal note having watched the live streams I have been brought to tears at times, the work, passion and dedication that Ashley, Holly, Jeremy & Angela do show towards the animals is just

amazing. I just feel that the process of getting the permits that hadn't been required previously has taken far too long. It is not fair on the animals or team to have this hanging around for so long when at times Ashley has been unsure if the beautiful animals are going to be euthanised.

Finally I feel a great deal of the appeal points are when the former president was in charge and seeing the hurt in Ashley's eyes with her having to loose a relationship with her father to ensure the animals and team are managed in the correct way as set out in the USDA guidelines.

Thank you for hearing my comments I hope they are taken into consideration when making the correct decision.
