Notice is hereby given that on October 2, 2023, the Hearing Examiner denied Special Use Permit PL22-133 to permit an Animal Preserve, Wildlife Education, Conservation, and Sanctuary Center on the subject property. Additionally, on October 2, 2023, the Hearing Examiner resolved two separate administrative appeals of an issued SEPA Mitigated Determination of Nonsignificance (MDNS) for the proposed animal preserve. The first appeal of the MDNS (PL22-0583) was filed by the applicant Predators of the Heart. The Hearing Examiner granted the appeal in part and denied it in part resulting in the upholding of the issued SEPA subject to modifications. The second appeal of the MDNS (PL22-0577) filed by the neighbor group was denied by the Hearing Examiner. The subject property lies within the Rural Reserve zoning/comprehensive plan designated area as indicated in the Skagit County Comprehensive Plan and associated maps. The subject property is addressed as 4709 Welch Lane, Anacortes, Washington, and is located in a portion of Section 35; Township 35 North; Range 01 East; Willamette Meridian, situated in unincorporated Skagit County, Washington (Parcel #: P128398).
