Proposal Description

Skagit County is conducting its periodic review and update of its Comprehensive Plan, Land Use/Zoning map, and Development Regulations pursuant to the Washington State Growth Management Act (GMA), RCW 36.70A.130(5). This non-project legislative action proposes plan, map and code amendments to address GMA requirements and consistency measures and to address local circumstances. The proposal is required under the Growth Management Act. Applicable sections of the Growth Management Act include, but are not limited to, RCW 36.70A.130, 36.70A.070, 36.70A.035, 36.70A.040, 36.70A.095, 36.70A.140. Below is a summary of the amendments:

- Consistency with recent changes to State laws: The proposal revises all goals and policies of the
 previously adopted 2016 Comprehensive Plan to be compliant with recent changes to state laws
 governing Comprehensive Plans including:
 - A new Climate Element, Resiliency Sub-element, and Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reductions Sub-element required by RCW 36.70A.070 and RCW 36.70A.095.
 - Revisions to the Housing Element to accommodate housing at all income levels based on the 20-year population forecasts required by RCW 36.70A.070, RCW 43.62.035.

- Consistency with recent changes to Regional Countywide Planning Policies: The proposal revises all goals and policies to adequately address recent changes to regional Countywide Planning Policies including the updates to the County's 20-year population, housing, and employment projections.
- Consistency with recently collected community engagement results or other public participation completed by the County: The proposal would incorporate recent community engagement collected by the County to ensure policies promote the community's collective future goals.
- Update the Comprehensive Plan Transportation Element and supporting documents, including: the transportation inventory, land use assumptions, travel forecasts, Level of Service (LOS) standards, current and future transportation needs, and a transportation financial plan.
- Consistency with the recently adopted Capital Facilities Plan: The proposal would revise the entire Comprehensive Plan document to ensure consistency with the recently adopted Capital Facilities Plan.
- Updates to data: Revisions to demographic, geographic, environmental, housing, transportation, and economic data necessary for inventory and assessment of Skagit County's land use, services, and facilities.

The following amendments to the Skagit County Comprehensive Land Use/Zoning Map are proposed:

• [Pending Docketing by the Board of County Commissioners on February 25] The City of Anacortes has submitted a docket petition to expand its Urban Growth Area (UGA) as part of the 2025 Skagit County Periodic Comprehensive Plan update. The petition seeks to incorporate nine (9) city-owned parcels, totaling 107.24 acres, into the Anacortes UGA. The parcels include P20029 (20 acres), P60751 (3.04 acres), P60752 (5.74 acres), P60763 (5.74 acres), P60777 (2.86 acres), P19298 (20 acres), P19211 (0.54 acres), P19056 (40 acres) and P32547 (9.32 acres). The city-owned parcels are all zoned Rural Reserve (RRv), with the exception of P32547, which is zoned Rural Resource – Natural Resource Lands (RRc-NRL). The City is requesting that all of these parcels be zoned under the Anacortes UGA Urban Development District and to remove the Natural Resource Designation from parcel P32547. Additionally, the City plans to apply a Parks zoning designation to the properties on the Anacortes Future Land Use map. Once annexed, these lands will be assigned the Parks zoning designation on the Anacortes Zoning map. These city-owned parcels will not be used to accommodate City population, housing, or employment growth targets and will only be used for recreational and city operational uses.

Public hearing testimony is usually limited to three minutes, so written comments are preferred.
