Description

The Skagit Board of County Commissioners (Board) will hold a public hearing and take possible action regarding an extension of adopted Ordinance #O20240003, an interim ordinance temporarily prohibiting the acceptance of new permits for event venues on Skagit County agricultural land. The interim ordinance, effective July 23, 2024, clarifies that permissible tourism-related activities on Skagit farmland do not include permanent businesses hosting large events, such as weddings and concerts. Additionally, the ordinance requires that businesses engaging in agritourism activities that are not in compliance with Skagit County regulations must enter into a voluntary compliance agreement (VCA), with a deadline of May 30, 2025. The VCA is a standard contract used by Skagit County Code Enforcement to ease enforcement of agreed-upon compliance terms and conditions. RCW 36.70A.390 and RCW 36.70.795 authorizes the Board to renew a moratorium, interim zoning map, interim zoning ordinance, or interim official control for one or more six-month periods if a subsequent public hearing is held and findings of fact are made prior to each renewal.

Public hearing testimony is usually limited to three minutes, so written comments are preferred.
