

**DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE/NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY AND PUBLIC HEARING
SKAGIT COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION
REGARDING PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SKAGIT COUNTY CODE UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE,
TITLE 14, RELATING TO TRANSMISSION PIPELINE SAFETY**

Description of Proposal: A non-project, legislative action to amend the Skagit County Unified Development Code, Title 14, to add a new code section addressing the issue of hazardous liquid/natural gas transmission pipeline safety in Skagit County.

Notice of Public Hearing: A public hearing on the proposal will be held on Tuesday, June 7, 2011, in the Skagit Room of the Skagit County Commissioners' Administrative Building located at 1800 Continental Place, Mount Vernon, Washington, beginning at 6:00 p.m. or as soon thereafter as possible, and continuing until 9:00 p.m. or no further comment is forthcoming. Deliberations on the matter are scheduled to be held on July 19, 2011.

Public Comment: Your views for or against the proposed modifications are invited by attendance, representation, or letter. Written comments (faxed, mailed, or delivered) will be received at the Planning & Development Services Department until 4:30 p.m. on Monday, June 6, 2011. Written comments may also be submitted at the public hearing. Written comments must be submitted on 8 ½" x 11" paper. Maps must be in black and white and also reduced to 8 ½" x 11" size for reproduction purposes. Submittals not meeting these requirements will, unfortunately, not be considered. Please specifically reference the proposed ordinance or issue that the comments relate to.

Comments may also be submitted online via a standard form at www.skagitcounty.net/pdscomments. To ensure comments are received and processed properly, comments sent by email are not accepted.

SEPA Threshold Determination: Skagit County has determined that this proposal does not have a probable significant adverse impact on the environment. An environmental impact statement is not required under the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) RCW 43.21C.030(2)(C). This determination was made after review of a completed environmental checklist and other information on file with the lead agency. This information is available to the public upon request.

This determination is issued pursuant to WAC 197-11-340(2) and WAC 197-11-630. Skagit County will not act on this proposal for fifteen calendar days from the date of issuance. Comments regarding this Determination of Non-significance must be submitted by Monday, June 6, 2011, and in the same manner as outlined above for public comments.

Pursuant to SCC 14.12.210, no administrative appeal process is available for this legislative action.
