## Background/Context

- Regional Transportation Plans are required to be consistent with countywide planning policies and with local comprehensive plans (RCW 47.80.023)
- GMA requires the transportation element of local comp plan to include a forecast of traffic for at least ten years (RCW 36.70A.070)
- GMA requires the County and Cities/Towns to include areas and densities sufficient to permit the urban growth that is projected.
  OFM provides a range of population growth at the county level. (RCW36.70A.110)

## Population/Employment Allocation Process

Target

Determine population/employment projectionCounty level

**UGA** share

Allocate growth to urban or rural geography

UGA Allocation

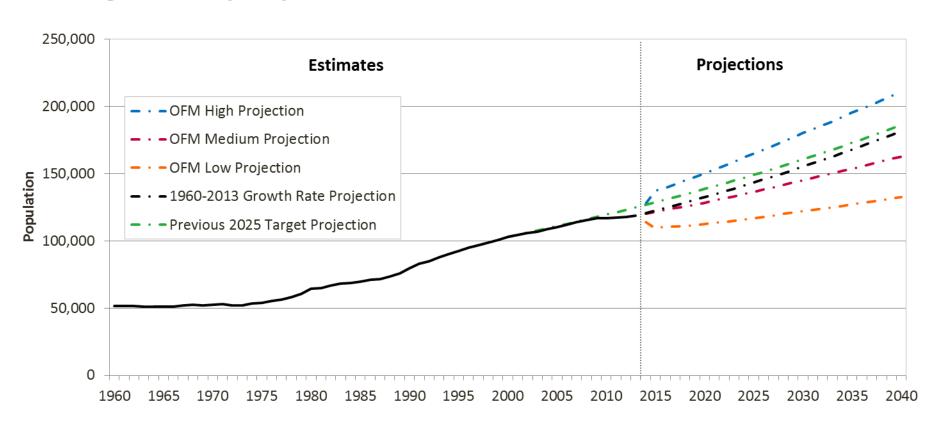
- Determine shares for individual geographies/UGAs
- Employment also allocated by sector

### Population and Employment Forecasts

- Population and Employment Forecasts are required for transportation and GMA planning
- GMA requires using Office of Financial Management (OFM) population forecast - Countywide
- Employment comes from someplace else
- Both Population and Employment have to be allocated to areas-City/UGA/Rural
- Forecasts for travel demand model have to be allocated to Traffic Analysis Zones (TAZs)

- OFM Medium Countywide Growth Projection = 155,451
  - Total Population Growth (2015 to 2036) = 35,751
    - Urban (80%) = 28,601
    - Rural (20%) = 7,150
- Total Countywide Employment = 67,762
  - Total Employment Growth (2015 to 2036) = 16,000
    - Urban (92%) = 14,719
    - Rural (8%) = 1,281

- 3. Monitoring Ongoing likely annual reports
- 4. Target Adjustments If needed

- Consistent Land Capacity Methodology part of GMA plan development
- 2. Monitoring Report with defined methods
- 3. UGA Expansion Policies and Procedures
