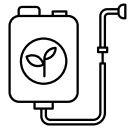


## Potential Polluters

Here is a list of things that may be causing pollution at your business:



Open or leaky dumpsters



Fertilizer, pesticides, and herbicides



Leaky vehicles



Animal poop



Spilled materials



Wash water



Individual pollutants may not seem like a big deal, but when they all add up it becomes a huge problem!

## BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES

Easy techniques to reduce stormwater pollution

- Close dumpster lids
- Replace leaky dumpsters
- Prepare spill kits and plans
- Prevent and reduce spills and leaks
- Sweep regularly
- Clean up animal poop
- Maintain drainage facilities
- Keep wastewater out of storm drains
- Reduce pesticide and fertilizer use
- Comply with permits
- Educate staff on common pollutants

## The SCOOP on STORMWATER

### What is stormwater?

Stormwater is rain runoff from roads, roofs, parking lots, and other developed surfaces. The water picks up everything it flows over, including chemicals, oils, and dog waste.

### Where does it go?

Stormwater flows into rivers, streams, lakes, and marine waters. Water that goes down the storm drain is not usually treated before reaching waterways.

### Who does it impact?

Fish, shellfish, wildlife, plants, and... YOU! Polluted stormwater makes it a lot harder to use our water resources. Swimming, fishing, shellfish harvesting, and more are affected.
