Additional Comments

- Bill Blake: The county and CD should work together to increase voluntary actions in the county to better respond to the 5 Year Report concerns
- Brandon Roozen: There should be a focus on incorporating different landowners into the program
- Ron Wesen: There is a concern about there not being enough outreach. The cover crops are great, but what problems do they solve?
- Bill Blake: We should also focus on figuring out the barriers to buffer planting incentives and try to address them.
- Leslie Michel: WSDA has an RFP out for soil sampling. There may be monitoring value in getting landowners to participate in the county.
 - Wesen: When does this take place?

- Michel: Date not set, but it is set to look at factors associated with soil health to see if certain practices are having an impact.
- Roozen: What are the measurements?
 - Michel: They are typical soil sample metrics
- Wesen: There is real concern over publicly available information about dairy farms. Will the data be publicly requestable?
 - Michel: There is an effort to protect the data collected, but everything is open to public disclosure.
- Wesen: Dairies will probably not want to participate due to the information being available to the public.
 - Vander Kooy: Agreed, these are sensitive topics that open dairires up to lawsuits.
- Roozen: Will this be brought up at the state level?
 - Michel: Policy makers need to hear these concerns from the producers.
 - Vander Kooy: The Dairy Federation is a valuable resource.
- Brandon Roozen: Commissioner Wesen, is there a desire to further incorporate shellfish protection measures into VSP reporting?
 - Wesen: Agreed that they are important, but what can we show?
 - Dewey: Benefits downstream from VSP efforts will be shown with fewer closures, but not sure if they can be helped.
 - Roozen: Will follow up with commissioners at the county level.

Skagit Conservation District Interlocal Agreements

Cover Crop Program

- Emmett Wild: Was able to allocate most of the funds within the first week. There were 10 participants, and 618 acres planted. All 30k in funds were used.
- Bill Blake: Think about future funding for cover crops, and increase available funds.
 - Wild: Other programs are also useful to be funded.
 - Dewey: Avoid crops that are bird forage.
 - Vander Kooy: Agreed about crop types.
 - See: 9k budgeted for VSP projects in 2022.
 - Will see at the end of the year if the county can increase the amount.

Skagit VSP Updates

Open Discussion / Questions

- Brandon Roozen: Should we be tracking estuary restoration projects?
 - The county should be supporting the Skagit Tidegates Initiative. A lawsuit has been issued in respect to the program, and tidegate repairs are needed.
 - Symonds: The Commissioners have been responsive to the initiative, and it should be addressed at that level.
- Brandon Roozen: The ag viability piece of VSP needs to be addressed somehow
 - o Will talk at a later date to get up to speed.
 - o See: The county should discuss more about what it should be supporting.
