

FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT WILL REST ON VOTERS

Special Election Will Be
Called December 3 To
Determine Issue

NOTICES ARE POSTED

Entire Mainland of County Is In-
cluded In Proposed
District

Proposals for the organization of a flood control area in Skagit County to be known as the "Skagit County Flood Control District" will be placed before registered voters of the affected localities at a special election which will be held on Tuesday, December 3.

Skagit County's flood district will include all of Skagit County situated on the main land and all other portions of the county except Fidalgo island and other islands in and surrounded by the waters of Puget Sound.

The order for the election was made by E. F. Banker, director of Conservation and Development for the state of Washington, and was mailed to County Auditor Carl P. Kloke on October 17.

Notices of election are being posted in all of the commissioners' districts today. Voters are reminded that they must be registered in order to participate in the voting. Registrations close 20 days prior to the date of election. The ballots will contain two statements, one of which the voter will have to check. The statements are "Flood control district—Yes" and "Flood control district—No."

Should the flood control district be approved at the December 3 balloting, the county commissioners will levy a two mill tax to finance the project.

Residents in the Stillaguamish valley will vote on the same day for the formation of a flood control there. A Nooksack river district will come up for election on December 7.
