Skagit Must Furnish \$1,000,000 for Spillway

Congress Approves Expenditure of \$2,982,000 For Avon to Padilla Bay Channel For Skagit River Flood Control

> Although congress yesterday approved the expenditure of \$2,-982,000 in federal funds for the diversion of the Skagit river from Avon to Padilla bay, there appeared little likelihood this morning that the project would mater-

Skagit County will be required to expend more than one million dollars for the purchase of right-of-way, and damage to oyster lands, an expenditure which the county commissioners say is far out of reach of the county's present financial abili-

Press releases from Seattle today stated that the Skagit river project at an expenditure of \$2,-982,000, was approved. A figure of \$3,150,000 announced by this district's representative yesterday, was declared incorrect.

Army engineers who surveyed the Skagit river situation more than a year ago advocated the construction of a channel from Avon to Padilla Bay as an effective means of ending flood menaces in the lower Skagit valley.

The Skagit project is part of a \$10,619,100 program for Western Washington flood control, all of which is included in a \$320,000,000 omnibus flood control bill.

Other appropriations included Mud Mountain reservoir on the White river, \$3,177,000; Puyallup river channel improvement, \$2,349,000; Lewis River, \$208,000; Ctilloguemick sizes \$221,000

Stillaguamish river, \$261,000.
Cowlitz County, \$729,700; Wahkiakum County, \$369,200; Pacific County, \$22,700.
