Dike Vote Close In District Twelve

In the closest dike district election yet reported from Tuesday's elections in the county, Bob Shroeder was elected in district 12 with only 31 out of the 84 votes cast.

Shroeder won by only three votes over Harold McMoran (28), who was followed closely by Bill Jewett with 25.

Dike district two had a close one, too, with Arne Olson getting in with 26 votes, for a six-vote margin over Phil Iverson. Largest vote was reported from dike district one, where James Leckenby, Sr., replaced incumbent Clair Moores, 105-52.

Others of the 16 diking districts reporting showed in: 4—Frank Baublitz, seven out of eight votes; 9—Alvin Thulen, eight votes; 8—Roy Crumrine, five out of six; 15—Pete Nelson, 17 votes; 18—Alvina Crogstad, five out of six, and 21—Lawrence Larson, eight out of 10 votes.

in the two drainage districts reported: 15—Elwood Harmon, 64 out of 69, and 18—C. R. Poldervart, seven out of eight. Six other drainage districts had not reported, as well as seven more dike elections, County Auditor Ed Danielson said at noon.
