

Skagit harbor, river projects in new budget

Skagit Valley rivers and harbors are included in the outlay of funds sought in President Eisenhower's fiscal 1962 budget, Second District Congressman Jack Westland told the Herald last night.

The outgoing President's budget message included the following sums for projects planned by the United States Corps of Army Engineers:

SWINOMISH Channel, operation and maintenance, \$125,000.

Skagit River, general investigation for flood control projects, \$50,000.

Skagit River, navigation project, general investigation, \$9,400.

Anacortes harbor, operation and maintenance, \$30,000.

No additional details were disclosed on the projects by Congressman Westland's message.

Other Northwest Washington projects for which funds were budgeted:

EDMONDS harbor, general investigation, \$20,000; Snohomish River navigation project, general investigation, \$200,000; Point Roberts navigation project, general investigation, \$20,000; Port Townsend navigation project, advance engineering and design, \$37,000.

Quillayute River navigation project, operation and maintenance, \$40,000; Sammamish River flood control, advance engineering design, \$58,000; Snohomish River flood control investigation, \$75,000; Stillaguamish River flood control investigation, \$15,000, and Nooksack River flood control investigation, \$15,000.
