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



#### **Executive Summary**

- Flood risk management project
- Population at risk: ~25,000
- Flood fight efforts have prevented loss of life & flood damages = high risk
- Protect critical infrastructure in floodplain
- Tentatively Selected Plan (TSP) identified, draft FR/EIS out for public review & comment
- TSP: least environmental impacts, among plans considered/final array




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#### **TSP: CULI Alternative**


