Local Measures

Darrington School District
No. 330
Proposition No. 1

The Board of Directors of Darrington School District No. 330 adopted Resolution No. 453-04-26, concerning a proposition for a replacement levy for education. This proposition would authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, replacing an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District, for educational programs and operations expenses not funded by the State, including reduced class sizes, counselors, arts, athletics, music, extracurricular activities:

Hospital District 304
Proposition No. 1

The Commission of Skagit County Public Hospital District No. 304, Skagit County, Washington (United General District 304) adopted Resolution No. 2026-04 concerning the district's regular property tax levy. If approved, this proposition would provide additional operating and capital funds for United General District 304 to provide additional healthcare services to its residents and other persons served by United General District 304. It authorizes a maximum regular property levy rate for collection in 2027 of 50 cents per \$1,000 of assessed value. The 2027 levy amount will be used for the purpose of computing the limitations for levies in subsequent years.

Fire Protection District No. 8
Proposition No. 1

The Board of Skagit County Fire Protection District No. 8 adopted Resolution No.5-2026 concerning a proposition to maintain and adequately fund District operations. This proposition would finance fire protection and emergency medical services by restoring the District's regular property tax levy in 2026 to an amount not to exceed \$1.25 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation and authorize setting the limit factor at 103% for each of the following five years. The maximum allowable levy in the final year shall serve as the base for subsequent levy limitations as provided by Chapter 84.55 RCW.
